Whereas it appears by a certificate from the Lieutenant of a Regiment of Foot that Cornelius Poulson was fined by a Court Martial on the 7th Day of December 1701 for neglecting to march to George Town under Lieutenant Col Wood in the sum of twenty pounds specie and it appears by the Deposition of Major Joseph Wells that he has reason to believe the said Cornelius Poulson was not able to do Military duty at the Time he was ordered to George Town - We therefore direct that the said fine of twenty pounds imposed by the said Court Martial be and is hereby remitted. -

Daniel Young of Worcester County by his Petition sets forth that he was bound over to Court under a recognizance of two thousand pounds Continental Currency for an Assault, that he attended two Courts during which Time the Sentence never attended, that he by indisposition was incapable of attending the last Court in consequence of which an Execution issued that he is exceedingly poor and needy and prays relief - Four of the Magistrates of the said County having recommended that the prayer of the Petitioner be granted - We therefore direct that the said sum of two thousand pounds Continental Money be remitted the said Daniel Young and that no further Proceedings be had on the said forfeited recognizance on his the said Daniel Young paying the legal Fee. -

Elisha Mumford of Worcester County represents to the Board that he was bound over to October Court last in a recognizance for forty pounds current Money for Fornication, that his Security attended and tendered the Money for the Time thereon but not being able to discharge the Officers Fees in specie the whole was delayed until a future day and in consequence an Execution issued a sufficient number of the Magistrates from the said County having recommended that the prayer of the Petition of the said Elisha Mumford be granted - We do therefore order that the said forty pounds be remitted the said Elisha Mumford and that no further Proceedings be had on the said forfeited recognizance on his the said Mumfords paying the legal Fee. -
