

Henry Hawkins fourteen pounds, five shillings and six pence. Spent out of the money that came from the Havana, put into the Treasury by Major General Smallwood, to be by them accounted for and charged to the United States. -

Saturday 12th October 1702

Ordered that the western shore Treasurer pay to Richard Litley twenty four pounds, twelve shillings Spent out of the twenty thousand pounds appropriated for the Payment of Creditors of a particular description due him for Money lent per Certificate passed. -

That the said Treasurer pay to Joseph Baxter twenty seven pounds, eleven shillings and eight pence Spent agreeable to the Act to adjust the Debts due from this State balance of Jonathan Hudson's Order to him 5th June 1700 per Account passed. -

That the said Treasurer pay to Ferdinando Battee nineteen pounds, four shillings Spent agreeable to the Act aforesaid per Account passed.

That the said Treasurer pay to Lieut^t Young Wilkinson five pounds, fifteen shillings and nine pence Spent part of the advance directed to be made, by the Act relating to public Creditors on Account. -

That the said Treasurer pay to Elizabeth Minsky two pounds five shillings Spent out of the money appropriated for the Barges due her per Account passed. -

Commissions of Letters of Marque and Reprisal issued to Christopher Tompkins commander of the Schooner God and Easy, seventy five Tons burthen, navigated by thirty five men, mounting ten Carriage Guns, belonging to William Spear and Compy Baltimore - Samuel Williams Commander of the Brig Tarter forty Tons burthen, navigated by twenty five men, mounting ten Carriage Guns, belonging to Robert Smith of the Havana - and also to William Smith Commander of the Brig Escape, seventy five Tons burthen, navigated by thirty men, mounting twelve Carriage Guns, belonging to James Smith and others of Baltimore -

Sunday 14th October 1702

Commission of Letters of Marque and Reprisal issued to Charles Dashiell Commander of the Schooner Glo, seventy nine Tons burthen, navigated by twenty five men, mounting six Carriage Guns, belonging to Andrew Kemm, Annals, William Taylor and others of the State of Maryland. -

Ordered that the western shore Treasurer pay to Lucy Riddle sixteen pounds, four shillings and nine pence - Doct. Thomas Hower six pounds, eighteen shillings - Thomas Sadler eight pounds, eight shillings & four pence - and Ignatius Taylor sixteen pounds Spent agreeable to the Act to adjust the Debts due from this State per Cert^s & Accounts passed. -

That the said Treasurer pay to Elizabeth Swabell three pounds, twelve shillings and six pence Spent due her per Accounts passed.

That the said Treasurer pay to Major John Davidson twenty seven pounds & three pence and Capt Henry Gaither twenty five pounds, twelve shillings and five pence Spent, out of the money that came from the Havana, put into the Treasury by Major General Smallwood, to be accounted for & charged to the U.S.
