

Ordered that the Spring Commissary do unto Sub Doctor <sup>Page 49</sup>  
Bancroft of Flour on Account -

Monday 21. October 1702

From the peculiar circumstances of Benjamin Wilson a Soldier who  
was discharged from the Private Regiment the 15<sup>th</sup> September 1702 who for-  
merly belonged to Col. Hazens Regiment and Hugh McCoy of the same  
Regiment discharged from the Private Regiment the 15<sup>th</sup> Sept: 1702 and  
were Citizens - this state it being impossible for them to obtain Certificates re-  
quired by Law. The Board are of opinion that the Commissioners for settling  
and adjusting the Accounts of the Troops do ought to grant them Cer-  
tificates for their Depreciation to August 1700 taking their own Oaths;  
there being no other way of ascertaining it for the Time when they  
enlisted. -

Tuesday 22<sup>nd</sup> October 1702

Ordered that the western shore Treasurer pay to Francis Bel-  
more thirty nine pounds, eight shillings and six pence half penny upon  
agreement to the Act to adjust the Debts due from this State due him  
per Certificate adjusted. -

That the said Treasurer pay to Capt Richard Waters twenty  
five pounds, ten shillings and six pence and Ensign William Godbo-  
rough twenty two pounds, six shillings and three pence specie out  
of the money that came from the Havana, put into the Treasury by Major  
General Smallwood, to be by them accounted for and charged to the  
United States. -

That the western shore Treasurer pay to John Shaw  
twenty four pounds, ten shillings specie due him for Drums and  
Fifes, a Key to the Iron Chest and Coffins per Accounts passed. -

That the said Treasurer pay to William Smith Esquire  
one hundred and fourteen pounds, thirteen shillings and eight pence  
specie out of the twenty thousand pounds appropriated for the paymen-  
t of Creditors of a particular description for money lent 11<sup>th</sup> of May 1700  
per Accounts passed. -

That the said Treasurer pay to Gilbert Middleton one  
hundred and sixteen pounds, ten shillings and seven pence specie out of  
the money appropriated for the Barges due him on Account passed.

Wednesday 23<sup>rd</sup> October 1702

Summons issued to Samuel Shaw, James Patterson, James  
Heigh, Samuel Harris, Isaac Clark, Thomas Gray, and Walter Smith  
Esquires of Calvert County to be and appear before the Governor and  
Council on the 29<sup>th</sup> Day of October Instant to testify in the Case  
of the Election for Sheriff of said County. -

Ordered that the western shore Treasurer pay to Rigobert  
Wilmoth thirty six pounds, eleven shillings and three pence specie  
out of the money appropriated for the Barges due them  
Accounts passed. -
