Mr. Ebenezer Mackie a Subject of Great Britam who hath lately arrived in this State appeared before this Board and did voluntarily make repeat and subscribe a Declaration of his Belief in the Christian Religion and took repeated and subscribed the Oath presented in the "Act for Naturalization" wherefore he is considered as a Subject of this State. —

Ordered that the western shore Treasurer pay to Gilbert Middleton for the use of Joseph Middleton seven pounds, five shillings out of the money appropriated for the Barges per Account passed. —

That the said Treasurer pay to Col<sup>o</sup> Edward Gaither seventy eight pounds and six pence specie due him for Balance of his Account passed. —

That the said Treasurer pay to Doct. John Sprigg, seven hundred and ten pounds, three shillings and seven pence specie agreeable to the Act to adjust the Debts due from this State per Certificate adjusted 29<sup>th</sup> April.

That the <sup>pay to</sup> Treasurer, Benjamin Harwood Esq. Receiver of the Continental Taxes in this State two hundred and ten pounds, six shillings and three pence specie arising from the Sale of part of Wisconsin Manor and directed to be remitted to Congress by the Act for the Sale of certain Confiscated British property passed April Session 1702.

Commissions issued to George Brown appointed Captain in the room of Daniel Shuler removed out of the State — John Shoemaker 1<sup>st</sup> Lieut. Christopher Need 2<sup>d</sup> Lieut. and John Mott Ensign in the Colonel's Battalion of Militia in Frederick County. —

Monday 2<sup>d</sup> December 1702

Commission issued to Griffin Tambloroy appointed a Colonel in Queen Anne County in the room of Abner Turner deceased. —

Certificates given to William Atchison Commander of the Brig<sup>o</sup> St. Patrick, one hundred and thirty nine Tons burthen, navigated by thirty men, mounting six Carriage Guns, belonging to Stephen and Angel Quone and Robert Smith He of Cape Francois, there being no Commission of Letters of Marque in the possession of this Board. —

Tuesday 3<sup>d</sup> December 1702
