His Excellency the Governor & all Members present

Ordered that the western Shore Treasurer pay to Thomas
Townsend eighteen pounds, specie due him per Account passed. —

That the said Treasurer pay to Robert Smith thirty seven
pounds, four shillings specie due him per Account passed. —

That the said Treasurer pay to Dyre Betton Esq^r Surveyor
of Queen Anne County fifty four pounds, nine shillings and nine pence three
farthings per Account passed. —

It appearing from the Certificate of Capt Eckoff that Matthew
Hetcher a Militia Man of Frederick County, served under him his Tour
of Duty, instead of serving it under Capt Daniel Smith for which he was
fined £20. We therefore remit the whole of the said Fine. —

It appearing that Alexander Major of Frederick County was
fined Twenty pounds by a Court Martial for not marching to George Town. and
it being represented by a letter from William Winchester Junr his Captain. that
he certainly did march and performed a part of his Tour of Duty, and that he
afterwards enrolled as a Select Militia man and was therefore excused from
completing it. Wherefore it is agreed that the whole of his Fine be remitted. —
