Ordered that the western shore Treasurer pay to John Mill Twenty seven pounds, nineteen shillings and eight pence specie agreeable to the Act to adjust the Debts due from this State per Account passed. -

That the said Treasurer pay to Thomas Callahan Twenty three pounds, eighteen shillings and ten pence specie for one years Interest on a Certificate issued agreeable to the Act to adjust the Debts due from this State" -

Monday February 10th 1783.

Commissions of Letters of Marque and Reprisal issued to Stephen Bengett commander of the Brigantine *Hibernia* fifty Tons burthen, navigated by fifteen men, mounting four Lamiage Guns, belonging to Pringle & Wilson of Philadelphia and also to Robert Ewart Commander of the Brigantine *Eagle* one hundred and sixty Tons burthen, navigated by twenty four men, mounting five Lamiage Guns belonging to Thomas Russell and others of Baltimore. -
