Tuesday 28th October 1783.

Present the Honorable Benjamin Stoddert, Gabriel Duwall & James Bruce Esquires -

Ordered that the western shore Treasurer pay to Thomas Johns Eleven pounds two shillings and ten pence specie agreeably to the "Act to adjust the Debts due from this State per Certificate" adjusted the 27th Instant -

That the said Treasurer pay to Elias Keston one pound ten shillings and three pence and to Ann Procter and Catherine Sallowood each, one pound two shillings and six pence out of the money appropriated for contingent Expenses per Account passed -

Wednesday 29th October 1783.

Present as on Yesterday -

Ordered that the western shore Treasurer pay to James White One hundred and thirty two pounds, six shillings and eleven pence specie agreeably to the "Act to adjust the Debts due from this State" due him on a State Certificate No 863 adjusted by the Deputy Auditor -

That the said Treasurer issue a Certificate to Enoch Jenkins agreeably to the "Act proposing to the Citizens of this State, Creditors of Congress &c" for seven pounds, three shillings and two pence due on Continental Loan Office Certificate adjusted by the Deputy Auditor -

That the said Treasurer issue a Certificate to Luther Martin Esquire agreeably to the Act aforesaid for one hundred and fifty seven pounds, six shillings and three pence due on Continental Loan Office Certificate adjusted by the Deputy Auditor the 28 Instant -

That the said Treasurer pay to Jonathan Stater Twelve pounds, eighteen shillings and three pence current money for one year's interest on a Certificate issued under the "Act to adjust the Debts due from this State" Number 13. dated 19th July 1781. -

A Petition from Charles Bosley of Baltimore County, praying a Remission of a forfeited Recognizance, was presented to the Council, and read; setting forth that in the year 1781. he became security for a certain Vincent Tragnell, of the County aforesaid in the penalty of five thousand pounds of the then current Money for his appearance at the General Court to answer an accusation of having resisted one of the Collectors of Baltimore County in the Execution of his Duty: that the said Tragnell became bound for his appearance in the like sum, and neglected to appear, and his Recognizance was forfeited, as well as that of the Petitioner; that Execution issued against said Tragnell and the sum of one hundred and twenty five pounds red money was levied and paid by him in Discharge of said Execution. and the like process hath issued against the Petitioner for the same sum, which he is unable to pay without the ruin of his Family; that the said Tragnell hath since the forfeiture of his Recognizance been fined by the Judges of the General Court the sum of six pounds current money and Costs, which he has also paid: and thereupon the Council taking the said Petition into Consideration upon the foregoing State and the Recommendation of the Judges of the General Court for a Remission, and public Justice appearing to have been satisfied by levying the sum forfeited by the principal Vincent Tragnell for his Non appearance, and the fine imposed with Costs as beforementioned & the Circumstances of the Petitioner entitling him to mercy. the Council are of opinion that the said forfeited Recognizance be remitted & do order accordingly. -
