

A Petition from the Justice James of Baltimore County was received and read, whereunto that he had been prosecuted in Baltimore County Court for an assault on certain John Dingle upon which Petition he submitted and was fined on the return of the said Dingle, the sum of One hundred Pounds at the new Court ensuing. But the said John Dingle afterwards brought such a writ as a Damages and was convicted at appearing on the trial that no assault had been committed on the said John Dingle and therefore praying for a Remission of the said fine and therefore the Board taking the same into Consideration and in appearance from the Justices of two of the Justices of Baltimore County Court that the case of the said John Dingle's was truly stated in the Petition above said and of course that the aforesaid fine should be remitted and so therefore remit the same.
