To each of the Captains and Lieutenants five shillings and six pence per Day
To the Men who were enlisted for twelve months, the Pay allowed by Law until the 3rd Day
of April 1783 except in Case where they have wilfully absented themselves. —

To George Grason Lieutenant of the Barge Revenge, the Pay of Lieutenant to the
first Day of January 1783.

To each of the men taken Prisoners on board the Barge Revenge at the time
of the Death of Commodore Grason, half pay until the 1st Day of January 1783.

That the Account of the wounded Men for Medicines be paid. —

That all the Clothing remaining in the Hands of Thomas Johnson Jun^r Commissary
of the Barges be delivered to the Intendant of the Revenue, with the request of this
Board to be delivered out to such of the Injured Soldiers now in this City as he may
think are most in need. —

The Board allow W^t Thomas Johnson Jun^r for his Services as
Paymaster and Clothier to the Crews of the several Barges employed in the Chesapeake
Bay, and for keeping and settling the Accounts relative thereto a Commission of 4th Feb^r

Ordered that the western shos Treasurer pay to Thomas Johnson Jun^r
Paymaster Three hundred pounds current money out of the money appropriated for the
Barges except under the Act entitled "An Act for the Protection of our Bay Trade and
to defend our Citizens exposed to Plunder by the Enemys Barges" on Account

That the said Treasurer pay to James O'Hara a Blind Soldier Two
pounds current money allowed him by this Board in Pursuance of a Resolution of
the General Assembly passed July Session 1779, empowering and directing the Governor
and Council to grant the said James such Relief as they may think proper. —

Ordered that on Tuesday next the Board will take into Consideration
the appointment of a Judge of the General Court in the room of the late Honorable
Nicholas Thomas Evans. —
