M<sup>r</sup> John Davidson returns an Order drawn by this Board of the 23<sup>rd</sup> of August 1782 on the Western Shore Treasurer to John and Samuel Davidson, for fifty two pounds, thirteen shillings and eight pence specie a credit to the "Act to adjust the Debts due from this State" being the Balance of an Order in favor of Col<sup>t</sup> Baker Johnson dated the 9<sup>th</sup> of May for One hundred and three pounds, eleven shillings and two pence, which the Board rec<sup>s</sup>eives, it appearing that the said Order has not been paid by the Treasurer, and that the Money due to Col<sup>t</sup> Johnson ought to have been paid in specie and not otherwise. —
