same to the 10th of October 1783 amounting to Eighty three pounds, eight
Shillings passed by the Auditor General exhibited to this Board and examined
and approved.

A Petition from Moratio Ford of Baltimore County was
laid before the Board setting forth that he was unfortunately led to a quarrel
with a certain Charles Atket for which he was indicted, and two Prosecumens
found against him at a May Term 1782 - that being Ignorant of Court Proceed-
ings, he neglected to attend according to the Tenor of his Recognizance, whereby
the same together with the Recognizance of Philip Turnwood his Bail became
forfeited for which Suit is instituted against him and his Bail for Sixty pounds
Current Money - that he is greatly distressed not being able to pay the
said fine and Costs more especially on Account of his Bail who is a good
Man with a considerable family who are wholly dependant on his Industry
and must suffer the extremity of severe Indigence if they are deprived of
the means of his Support which must be the case if he is thrown into
Prison for the Payment of the fine aforesaid, and therefore praying a
Remission thereof, and the Justice of the County Court of the said County
having certified that the Allegations set forth in said Petition are true
The Board taking the same into Consideration do order and direct a
Remission of the said forfeiture of Sixty pounds.
