

Whereas Benjamin Warfield of Westchester County hath applied to this Council to be relieved from a fine of thirty nine pounds, thirteen shillings and eight pence imposed on him by a Justice of the Peace for not marching with the 3<sup>d</sup> Regt of Militia the 2<sup>d</sup> Day of November 1777, and for which the Sheriff of said County executed the goods of the said Benjamin Warfield, for the amount of the fine and the cost of execution - and the said Warfield having appealed to the County Court of the said County made an Act of Assembly of this State for a mitigation of his fine. The Verdict was given against him, and the fine confirmed. And Whereas it appearing by the certificate of four of the Justices of the Court of the said County that the said Benjamin Warfield with a Wife and seven small Children must be reduced to the greatest distress, if the Execution against his Property should be carried into effect, and recommending his Case to the Board for a Remission of the said fine. Ordered therefore that the said fine of thirty nine pounds, thirteen shillings and eight pence be, and is hereby remitted
