

Consequently he was remanded to Prison, where he now remains - that his wife (who is Blind) and three small Children have since his Confinement become a charge to the Public and four of the Justices of the said County having recommended the said John Speer as an Object worthy of Relief - The Board are of Opinion that the said fine be remitted and do order and direct a Remission accordingly
