her the Surplus of Lewis Mortgage after discharging his own claim of
£1012. 10. 2 current money aforesaid, so that Mr. Shalmers's Obligation does not
appear as intended to be an Obligation of Indemnity to Mrs. Smith for
mortgaging her Estate for Swift's Debt but merely an Obligation to account
for the Surplus of Lewis Mortgage if any, after paying his own Debt as
aforesaid. From the language in the Obligation, it seems Mrs. Smith has
no Doubts of the sufficiency of the Surplus: but from an Account produced
of the Money due and received on Lewis Mortgage there does not appear
to be enough even to pay Mr. Shalmers own Debt - The claim therefore
of Mr. Sewell as Administrator aforesaid is not admissible, -
