Ordered That the western Shore Treasurer pay to the said State one pound ten shillings and six pence for 1 Month & 9 Days Board of James O'Connell a Surgeon on him in his sickness, a Coffin, Shroud & funeral Expenses and Burial in the said State from the 18<sup>th</sup> April to the 17<sup>th</sup> June 1785 allowed by this Board in pursuance of a Resolution of the General Assembly of 2 July 1779

A Petition from Andrew Lavelly of Baltimore County was laid before the Board, setting forth that he was arrested and confined in Baltimore County Jail for forfeited Recognizances and other Debts which he was unable to pay - That the said Recognizances became forfeited by his absence from the State at the time he was called to attend the Court as a Witness - And three of the Justices of the County aforesaid having certified that Andrew Lavelly was recognized at September Term 1784 in two several matters as a Witness against Jacob Eason in the sum of Thirty pounds for each, and also in the like sum for his Wife Elizabeth Lavelly - representing him as a Person unable to pay the said forfeitures, and recommending him to the Mercy of the Governor - The Board upon Consideration thereof do Order and direct that the several forfeited Recognizances aforesaid be remitted
