The following accounts against Confiscated Dutch Property are exhibited to this Board examined and approved.

A sum of Money in the City of Annapolis against Daniel Dulany Esq of Factor amounting with interest to this Day to Forty nine pounds, six shillings and seven pence - and also Robert Crawford against Robert Christie Esq of the same amounting with interest as aforesaid to Three hundred and thirty seven pounds sixteen shillings & four pence.

The Petition of Joseph S. Bishop of Baltimore's County was laid before the Board setting forth that he entered into a Recognizance in the sum of £100 pounds for the appearance of a certain Sarah Grouse at the January Criminal Court 1784 on suspicion of Felony. That previous to the meeting of the said Court he took the said Sarah Grouse and was carrying her before a Magistrate in order to deliver her up and obtain a discharge from his said Recognizance, when William Jefferson met them and offered himself as Bail for her whereupon the said
