The Council met

Ordered That the western shore Treasurer pay to Amos Alagard Eighty two pounds, two shillings and eight pence specie agreeably to the Act to adjust the Debts due from this State" per Certificate passed by the Aud<sup>r</sup> Gen<sup>l</sup> the 19<sup>th</sup> Instant

That the Said Treasurer pay to Jas<sup>o</sup> Henry Hollingsworth Two pounds, six shillings and One penny specie agreeably to the Act to adjust the Debts due from this State" per Account passed by the Aud<sup>r</sup> Gen<sup>l</sup> the 29<sup>th</sup> Instant

That the Said Treasurer pay to Richard Johns for the use of Robert Gable Seventeen pounds, ten shillings current Money for the like Sum paid by him on two Special Warrants of 3 April 1782 to affect the Reserves in Baltimore County

The Council adjourned till tomorrow morning 11<sup>o</sup> Clock

Charles Ridgely Esq<sup>r</sup> has offered to sell the State one hundred Tons of Pig Iron delivered at Tides point, at eleven pounds  $\text{\$}$  Term payable in three years bearing an Annual Interest of eight  $\text{\%}$  Cent. I think the purchasing of this Iron may be of considerable advantage to the State, by shipping it to London. M<sup>r</sup> Wallau and Company have offered to take it free of freight, if the ships they expect, arrive safe, and to allow me to draw Bills at Five pounds Sterling  $\text{\$}$  Term as soon as any ship sails on which it may be put onboard, and to draw for the residue as soon as advice may be received of the arrival of the Iron and the value known.
