

Ordered That the western shore Treasurer pay to Thomas & Madame Ten pounds, four shillings and two pence specie agreeably to the Act to adjust the Debts due from this State per Account passed by the Deputy Auditor this Day.

That the said Treasurer pay to Mrs Ann Sewacher widow of Lieut John Sewacher fifteen pounds for one quarter's half pay due the 1<sup>st</sup> instant

That the said Treasurer pay to Robert Goldborough Esquire Two hundred and fifty pounds for half a year's salary as one of the Judges of the General Court due the 1<sup>st</sup> instant

That the said Treasurer pay to Alexander Cortee Hanson Esq<sup>r</sup> one hundred & twenty five pounds for one quarter's salary as one of the Judges of the General Court, ending the 1<sup>st</sup> instant

Margaret Johnson of Baltimore County by her Petition sets forth, that she was prevented and indicted at Baltimore Criminal Court, last June term for selling liquors without licence, and on trial was found guilty, and was fined six hundred pounds of Tobacco and thirty shillings currency as appears by a transcript from the said Court, that she and an aged Mother have no other dependence for their subsistence than the industry and labor of the Petitioner, and that if the fine and fees are levied she must be reduced to a very low state and have neither food nor raiment to support them - a number of respectable inhabitants of Baltimore town having recommended a Remission of the aforesaid fine as also three of the Justices of the said Court - the Board are of opinion that the fine of six hundred pounds of Tobacco ought to be remitted, and do order and direct a Remission accordingly.
