of Admiralty due the 1st instant.

In Council November 24th 1789.

Isaac Lander of Somerset County by his Petition
to the Board sets forth that at Imo term 1788, he was fined in the County
Court of the said County, five hundred pounds of Tobacco, as an Offender of a
public road, for not clearing the said road twenty feet wide clear of ditches —
that the neglect proceeded from ignorance it not being expressed in his Warrant,
and he supposed that the keeping the road the width it had been kept for many
years, was all that was required of him — that he is poor and has a large
family to maintain — He therefore prays a remission of the said fine — And
five of the Justices of the said County having certified that from the best of their
information the facts stated in the petition are true and that the said Isaac
Lander ought not to have been fined, though the Law obliged them to give
judgment.
