

Saturday 27<sup>th</sup> February 1790

The Council met

Present as on yesterday.

Ordered that the western shore Treasurer pay to Thomas Johnson jun<sup>r</sup> one hundred pounds, for two quarters Salary as Clerk of the Council and the 1<sup>st</sup> November last - Sixty two pounds, ten shillings for one quarter's Salary due the 1<sup>st</sup> instant - and also the further sum of Forty eight pounds, Seventeen shillings and four pence and four farthings per account passed by the Auditor General.

That the said Treasurer pay to Capt David Lynn, the sum of twenty two pounds, fifteen shillings current Money and for five months pay to the following persons viz. - to George Clarke ten pounds, five shillings, and to Michael Wiser twelve pounds, ten shillings by virtue of a power of Attorney given by them to him which is this Day received into the General Court Office to be recorded, as appears by a certificate from under the hand of the Clerk of the said Office - as also the sum of Seventy five pounds current Money for five months pay due to the following persons, and in the following proportions viz. to Michael Standley twelve pounds ten shillings - to Jacob Standley Twelve pounds, ten shillings - to Benjamin Steward twelve pounds, ten shillings - to Richard Wiley ten pounds - to George Jennings Twelve pounds, ten shillings - to John Hancock Two pounds, ten shillings and to John Salmon Twelve pounds, ten shillings by virtue of letters of Administrators granted by the Register of Montgomery County to John Thornton as Administrator of the aforesaid John Salmon - to Christian Rejs as Administrator of Michael Standley & Jacob Standley aforesaid; to Christopher Reed as Administrator of Benjamin Steward aforesaid - to James Surren Administrator of Richard Wiley aforesaid; to Michael Lloyd Administrator of George Jennings aforesaid and to Peter Stephens Administrator of John Hancock aforesaid and by virtue of Powers given by the aforesaid John Thornton, Christian Rejs, Christopher Reed, James Surren, Michael Lloyd and Peter Stephens to the said David Lynn produced & lodged with the Board.

The following proposition was made and reported to

That a person be appointed on the part of this State to attend the sale of property, which may be taken in execution, issued at the instance of the State, and to purchase the same for the two shilling and six penny fund, and to purchase the same for the
