

Ordered that the western shore Treasurer pay to Robert Denny  
Fifty pounds for one quarter's Salary as Auditor Due the 1<sup>st</sup> instant

That the said Treasurer pay to Anthony Foy Administrator  
of John Beach late a Drum Major in the 4<sup>th</sup> Maryland Regiment Thirteen  
pounds, fifteen shillings for his pay from the 1<sup>st</sup> of August to the thirty first of December  
1780 per Certificate of Auditor —

It being suggested to the Board by William Campbell  
Esq<sup>r</sup> Agent for the Collection of taxes &c. that doubts are entertained respecting  
his authority to dispose of the property purchased during the last year for the  
use of the State in satisfaction of balances due from Collectors and their Securities.

Resolved that on the refusal or neglect of any Collector or Security whose  
property has been taken by the State as aforesaid to redeem the same by complying  
with the terms proposed or to be proposed by the said William Campbell in his description  
agreeably to the fifth Section of the Act of last Session entitled "An Act respecting  
the Collectors of the public taxes since the first of January seventeen hundred  
and eighty three," he be and hereby is authorized and directed to sell such prop-  
erty to the best advantage for the use of the State —
