Ordered that the Justices of the several Counties hereafter mentioned pay to General Williams Collector of Baltimore district the sums respectively annexed to the same, for an allowance of one penny on each hog-head of Tobacco inspected in the said Counties and shipped from the district aforesaid agreeably to an act entitled "An act to regulate the inspection of Tobacco. viz.

Prince Georges - 15th hhd^s - Twelve shillings & ten pence

Baltimore 539 - Two pounds, four shillings & eleven pence

Ann Arundel 1851 - Seven pounds, fourteen shillings & three pence
