The following Proclamation issued

By his Excellency John Eager Howard Esquire Governor of Maryland

A Proclamation

Whereas at a General Court held for the western shore  
of the State of Maryland on the tenth day of May last a certain Thomas  
Hadfield late of Baltimore County Merchant was indicted for the murder  
of David Sterrett of the same County Merchant; and whereas the Peace,  
unity and well being of the State require that such measures should be  
taken as may probably effect the arrest of the said Thomas Hadfield, so that  
he may be put upon his trial for the said offence I do therefore by the  
order and consent of the Council issue this my Proclamation, requiring all  
Magistrates, Justices of the Peace, Officers and other the good Citizens of this State to apprehend the said  
Thomas Hadfield and to bring him before some Judge or Justice within the  
said State to be dealt with according to Law -
