In Virtue of the Resolution of the General Assembly passed November Session 1790 empowering the Auditor General to adjust and settle, subject to the direction of the Board, all open and unsettled accounts between the State and Individuals upon equitable principles - The Board took into consideration the settlement of an account between the State and the late General Hooper, by which it appears there is due from him a balance of two thousand one hundred and twenty two pomsas, ten shillings and four pence three farthings, and after mature investigation of the same, are of opinion that the above balance was applied to the use of the Militia when in actual service and not to his own private account, and do therefore Resolve that the Auditor General be directed to credit the said General Hooper with the amount of the said claim and to forward this order with the vouchers, to Christopher Richmond Esquire Agent for the State, to be by him charged to the United States -
