

are paid and the Costs accruing on each presentment secured. That the offences upon the evidence did not appear grievous and that the parties to the Recognizances as they have reason to believe are in slender circumstances, and little able to pay the aforesaid forfeitures. And as they apprehend that the object of the Law has been complied with on the parts of the Petitioners, and that sufficient atonement has been made for the breaches of the Peace. They therefore recommend a total remission of the aforesaid forfeitures. The Board in consideration of all circumstances do order and direct that the said forfeitures, be remitted upon all costs arising thereon being paid.
