In Council May 10<sup>th</sup> 1792

Thomas Marshall of Prince Georges  
County by his Petition to the Board sets forth, that he  
being a Magistrate of Prince Georges County omitted  
to attend at Upper Marlboro at the meeting of the  
Magistrates under the Act of Assembly to regulate the  
Inspection of Tobacco, that he did not know it was  
necessary he should attend - that had he known that  
the Law required his attendance promtorily he would most  
certainly have endeavored to be present - that he had  
not seen the Law and believes that it had not been  
sent
