On the Petition of Jonathan Sellman
junr and William Maguder stating that they entered
into Bond dated 10th September 1782 as Securities of Alexan-
-der Trueman in the sum of ^{some} hundred and eighty
pounds to the State of Maryland payable in Specie Cer-
-tificates, for the purchase of a Tract of Land containing
133³/₄ Acres lying in Frederick County on Monocoy
Manor - that all the interest due on said Bond up to
the 10th of September ^{seventeen hundred and eighty six} was paid for
the 8th of June 1789 amounting to two hundred and
thirty five pounds four shillings ^{have been paid} -
that the said Alexander Trueman is become Insol-
-vent, and has removed out of the State - that William
Maguder one of the Securities is worth little or no
property, hath a large family now depending on him
for support, and that he is in actual confinement in
Goal for debt - that Jonathan Sellman the other Security
by accidents and misfortunes is reduced to a situation
which renders him unable to discharge the afore-
-said Bond - they also state that there is now due
for the rent of the said land about sixty pounds,
and that it is in a better situation than when pur-
-chased of the State, and therefore pray that the
said Land may be taken back on behalf of the State
and the bond in which they are Securities cancelled.

The Board believing the facts contained in the
Petition to be true, and considering the inability of
the Securities to pay for the property, the inevitable
