

entered into Bond with John Norris his security in the sum of thirty seven pounds, thirteen shillings and four pence payable to the State, for the purchase of certain Confiscated property - and the said William Smelair by his Petition sets forth that his Father has a lease for the said property, and withholds it from him - that John Norris his security is dead and was so involved that little will remain for a wife and six Children, after payment of his debts - and it also appearing by the Certificate of William McLaughlin, that the said Smelair has no property independent of his Father - The Board on consideration of his case do order and direct that the Bond aforesaid be cancelled upon the property being released to the State, and his paying all costs arising on the said Bond -
