

for which she paid the highest price, she could not by any means afford to charge less, and even at those rates her profit was very small - she was likewise well informed that the Tavern keepers in Annapolis and other places received at the same rate for similar articles - She represents that she is very old and infirm and lives only by her industry, and therefore prays a remission of the said fines, promising not to offend against the Laws in future - The Board upon consideration of all the circumstances do order and direct a remission of the fines aforesaid, upon condition that she pay all costs arising on the said Presentments.
