In Council September 10th 1792

Whereas by a certificate from the
 Clerk of Baltimore County Court of Oyer
 and terminer and goal delivery, it appears
 that Hugh Barkley was presented at January
 term last on two separate presentments for
 selling liquor without licence, and was fined
 by the Justices of the said Court, the quantity
 of six hundred pounds of Tobacco and Thirty
 Shillings, on each presentment, amounting in
 the whole to twelve hundred pounds of Tobacco
 and three pounds Current Money for said offence
 And the said Hugh Barkley by his Petition
 represents that he obtained a Tavern licence
 at Baltimore County adjourned Court November
 Term 1790 which authorised him to sell liquors
 until the September term following, at which
 term, he was unavoidably prevented from attending
 the Court, but having paid the full amount of
 a licence for a whole year and also five pounds
 for a year street tax, he conceived he might
 sell
