 places and manner of holding elections for Representa-
 tives of this State in the Congress of the United States
 and for appointing Electors on the part of this State
 for choosing a President and Vice-President of
 the United States, and for the regulation of the said
 Elections, and also to repeal the Act of Assembly
 therein mentioned," direct the Governor and Council
 after having received the returns, papers and instru-
 ments containing the number of votes, for each
 Candidate for Representatives of this State in the
 Congress of the United States, should enumerate
 and ascertain the number of votes, for each and
 every Candidate, and upon chosen as Representatives
 and by Proclamation signed by the Governor and
 dispersed through the State, declare the names of
 the persons duly elected as Representatives - We, in
 pursuance of the directions of the said Act, do by
 this our Proclamation declare that by the returns
 made to us it appears that George Dent, John
 Francis Mercer, Uriah Forrest, Thomas Sprigg
 Samuel Smith, Gabriel Christie, William
 Amidman and William Van Murray
 Esquires are duly elected Representatives of
 this State in the Congress of the United States
