

On the second Monday and twelfth day of November in the year Seventeen hundred and ninety two, the General Assembly of Maryland, proceeded agreeably to the Constitution and form of Government, to the choice of a Governor when Thomas Sim Lee Esquire was unannouncedly elected; and the same day qualified in the Senate Room in presence of the Members of both Houses of the Legislature, by taking the several Oaths required by the Constitution and Form of Government, and Laws of this State, and making and subscribing a Declaration of his belief in the Christian Religion.

On Tuesday the thirteenth Day of the same Month, the following Gentlemen were elected Members of the Council to the Governor
