

Ordered that the western shore Treasurer pay to John Shaw seventy four pounds thirteen shillings and eleven pence per account passed by the Auditor General

That the said Treasurer pay to James Ingell nineteen pounds due him per account passed by the Auditor

That the said Treasurer pay to Henry Ridgely seven pounds ten shillings for one quarter's salary as Clerk of the Senate due 1st February last.

In Council March 30th 1793

Whereas it appears by the Petition of John Holmes of Montgomery County that he is at this time and for several years has been a Justice of the Peace for Montgomery County — that he, after the passage of the Act of Assembly, entitled "An Act for the better administration of Justice in the several Counties of this State," thinking that agreeably to the said Act he was entitled to demand and take the sum of ten pence for administering the Oath in proving an account and for signing a certificate thereof, i.e. four pence for the Oath and six pence for the certificate he did demand and take the said sum of ten pence generally for that service, and among other instances/
