

Tuesday, November 19th 1793.

William Pinkney and John Davidson Esquires, Counsellors elect, appeared in the Council Chamber, and were qualified before Allen Dwyer Esq^r, a Justice of the peace for Anne Arundel County, by taking and subscribing the several oaths prescribed by the Constitution and Laws of this State, and by making and subscribing a declaration of their belief in the Christian Religion. Friday, November 22nd 1793.

Henry Ridgely Esquire, a Counsellor elect appeared in the Council Chamber and was qualified in the manner above recited.

Saturday, November 23rd 1793

The Council met. — present

John Kilty Esquire, a counsellor elect, having by a letter of this date declined accepting his seat at the Board, was appointed Clerk of the Council, and immediately qualified as such, in the manner prescribed by the Constitution and Laws of this State, before Henry Ridgely Esquire, an Alderman of the City of Annapolis.

The Board proceeded to the election of a Member in the room of John Kilty Esq^r; and on examination of the ballots, Christopher Richmond Esquire was found to be unanimously elected.

Monday, November 25th 1793.

An order issued on the Treasurer of the Western Shore to Henry Ridgely for Twenty two pounds, ten Shillings Current money, for nine months salary as Clerk of the Senate: ending the 1st instant
