

Andrew Wiesenthal was appointed a Justice of the Orphans of Kent County, in the room of James Ringgold (who resigned) and a commission was issued to James Claypoole, James Houit Anderson, and A. Wiesenthal.

Friday, November 29th 1793

The Council met: present as before.

An order was issued on the Treasurer of the Western Shore to Thomas Johnson jun^r, for thirteen shillings and four pence, for contingent expence of the Council, as per account passed by the Auditor.

Monday, December 1st 1793

The Council met. present His Excellency the Governor, and The Honourable, William Pinkney, John Davidson and Henry Ridgely Esquires

An order was issued on the Treasurer of the Western Shore, to Sergeant William A. Needham for eleven pounds five shillings; being his pension as an invalid for six months, ending the first of November last.

An order was issued in like manner to Thomas Johnson jun^r for Ten pounds ten shillings, for so much advanced by him to Thomas Halley and Miss Maria Gason in August last, when on a visit to their friends (allowed by The Governor).

Thursday, December 5th 1793

The Council met: Present as on Monday

An order was issued on the Treasurer of the Western Shore to Peter Engels, for sixty two pounds ten shillings; for one half year's salary as Armourer at Frederick Town, ending the 1st November last.

Saturday, December 7th 1793

The Council met: present as before.

An order was issued on the Treasurer of the Western Shore to Soc. for a certificate for one hundred and twenty two pounds ten shillings, in for the like sum issued the 6th April 1794 to Doctor James Murray; which upon depositions of the said Robert Lemmon and Joseph Lemmon his Brother irrecoverably lost and destroyed, by the foundering of a boat in which Joseph with the certificate aforesaid in his possession had taken his passage to Baltimore. The Certificate thus to be issued, to bear interest from the date of the same on the original one: agreeably to an Act of Assembly passed in Session 1792.
