

Monday, March the 24th 1794.

The Council met. Present as on the 10th.

It appearing to the Board that John Thompson, and William Williams of Baltimore County were bound in a recognizance of £10 each for the appearance of a certain Robert Mass before the Court of the said County at March Term 1792 and for his good behaviour in the interim, and that the said recognizance has by the non-appearance of the said Mass become forfeited, And it further appearing to the Board by the Certificate of four of the Justices of the said Court of Oyer & Terminer &c that the said Thompson and Williams are very indigent persons and utterly unable to pay the same, it is therefore Ordered that the aforesaid forfeitures be and they are hereby remitted, on payment of all legal Costs.

The Council met. Present His Excellency the Governor

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to James Doyle fourteen pounds eight shillings and nine pence for printing the naturalization Act, as per account passed by the Auditor.

Wednesday, March the 26th 1794.

The Council met. Present as yesterday.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Col Abiah Forrest thirty three pounds fifteen shillings, for one quarter's salary due the first of February last.

Commissions were issued to William Bowie as one of the Inspectors of Upper Marlbro Warehouse, and John M^c Daniel as one of the Inspectors of Piscattoway Warehouse, both in Prince George's County.
