

Tuesday, April 15<sup>th</sup> 1794.

The Council met; Present His Excellency the Governor, and The Hon.  
John Davidson,  
James Brice  
Henry Ridgely and  
Christopher Richards Esquire.

Ordered That the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to George Wedge Administrator of William Wedge late a private in the 7<sup>th</sup> Maryland Regiment twelve pounds ten shillings, for pay from the 1<sup>st</sup> of August to the 31<sup>st</sup> of December 1780, due him as per Certificate of the Auditor General, The said George Wedge having also produced a certificate from Samuel Tyler Register of Wills for Prince George's County, of his having taken out Letters of Administration on the Estate of the said William Wedge, and a certificate from William Bayley of the said George Wedge being the eldest son of the said William.

Wednesday the 16<sup>th</sup> April 1794.

The Council met. Present as on the preceding day.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to William John Jackson Sheriff of Prince George's County, Twenty pounds three shillings for enumerating and returning a List of the persons liable to Militia service according to an Act of Assembly "to regulate and discipline the Militia of this State."

Thursday April the 17<sup>th</sup> 1794.

The Council met. Present His Excellency The Governor, and The Hon<sup>ble</sup> John Davidson, Henry Ridgely & Christopher Richards Esq<sup>rs</sup>.

Samuel Vincent late a British subject appeared in the Council room, and in presence of the Board became a naturalized Citizen of this State, by making the declaration of his belief in the Christian Religion and by taking and subscribing the oath prescribed.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to William Melmot, Two pounds ten shillings, for work done for a Ship of the Government as per account allowed by the Governor.
