The Council met. Present His Excellency the Governor and the Hon^{ble}

William Pinkney

John Davidson

James Bruce, and

Henry Ridgely Esq^r.

The Board proceeded to the appointment of a Clerk of Talbot County Court in the room of Stevens deceased; when William Bond was elected, and commissioned to hold the said office until the next meeting of the said Court.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Solomon Holland Sheriff of Montgomery County Twenty two pounds one shilling & two pence for enumerating (and returning a list to this Board) of the persons liable to militia service in that County.

In consequence of a Letter from the Governor of Virginia, accompanied by a deposition, stating that a cruel outrage had been committed within that Commonwealth by a certain Thomas Powell on Tho^s Montjoy junior of Stafford County, who in consequence of the treatment received from the said Powell, had entirely lost his sight, and a demand contained in the said letter for the arrest and delivery of the said Powell to a person to be appointed on the part of Virginia to receive him, to answer in that Commonwealth for the crime wherewith he stands charged, A Warrant was issued under the Great Seal of the State, to the Sheriff of Calvert County (where the said Powell is now supposed to sojourn) directing him to apprehend the said Powell, and appear with him at Annapolis with all convenient dispatch.

(Note) Return was made on the 15th May by the Sheriff of Calvert County, importing that the said Powell was not in County.
