

Monday May 12th 1794

The Council met; Present His Excellency the Governor,
and all the Members.

Mark Alexander of Baltimore County having applied to be released from a purchase of certain confiscated property of the late Principio company, made by him in the year 1761, for the purchase money whereof he gave bond to the State with Robert Long and William King, as his securities, bearing date the 21st of September 1761; and it appearing to the Board that the said Mark Alexander and his securities are incompetent to the payment of the said purchase money and interest thereon due, and that it will be for the advantage of the State to release the said Alexander according to his application, and take back the property bought by him, It is Ordered That the said Mark Alexander be released from his purchase aforesaid, and that the Bond given as aforesaid by him and his securities be given up and cancelled, upon the said Mark Alexander's executing and delivering to the Agent a sufficient release on his part to the State, of all right, title and interest under and in virtue of the said purchase; and on the Bill filed by him and his securities or some of them in the Chancery Court, and there now depending relative to the said purchase, being dismissed with costs to complainants, to be paid before this order shall be effectual.
