

By the Petition of Temperance Hughes of Dorchester County it is set forth that at the last term of the court of the said County she was presented and fined in five several instances for retailing spiritous liquors without licence, whereby she has incurred in the whole, the penalty of thirty pounds besides costs. That she was led into the said offences by a belief that she had acquired a fair right to sell liquor by having purchased an unexpired licence of a certain William Jones. That she is extremely poor, and would be entirely ruined by the execution of the said fines. And the Justices of the said Court having certified their opinion that the facts are truly stated, and having recommended the Petitioner to the Clemency of the Board, it is Ordered that on payment of all costs the said fines amounting to thirty pounds be and they are hereby remitted.
