The Council met, Present His Excellency The Governor and  
The Hon<sup>ble</sup> John Davidson

Ch<sup>r</sup> Richmond Esquires.

Ordered That the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to  
John Randall Eleven pounds eighteen shillings and three pence due  
him on an account allowed by His Excellency the Governor, for store  
goods furnished Tho<sup>s</sup> Watley.

Ordered That the said Treasurer pay to Jobb. Fowler  
nine pounds, for so much advanced by the Governor's order for play tickets  
for Thomas Watley and Miss Grayson.

The Board being in possession of the returns from the Counties  
of Anne Arundel and Prince George's, and the City of Annapolis  
of an Election lately held for the choice of a Representative of the Third  
District in the Congress of the United States to supply the vacancy occasioned  
by the resignation of the Hon<sup>ble</sup> John Francis Mercer Esquire, by which it appears  
that the Hon<sup>ble</sup> Gabriel Duwall Esquire was chosen without opposition,  
Therefore it is declared that the said Gabriel Duwall Esquire is duly  
Elected a representative of this State in the Congress of the United States.
