

The Petition of Abraham O Sturgis for remission of a fine of six pounds, imposed by the Court of Worcester County for selling liquor without licence is rejected.

The Petitions of Solomon Thom of Worcester County, praying remission of a fine imposed on him for neglect of duty as Overseer of the roads, and of Elgate Quark of the same County for turning a public road without leave are rejected.

Resolved that for the purpose of carrying into execution the Act to regulate and discipline the Militia, The State be divided into three divisions To wit. The Counties of Allegany, Washington, Frederick, Baltimore & Harford in one division:— Those of Anne Arundel, Calvert, Prince George's, Charles, Saint Mary's, and Montgomery in another division; and those of the Eastern Shore in a Third.

Wednesday, June the 11th 1794.

The Council met: Present His Excellency The Governor, and all the Members.

Commission issued to John Ross, Thomas Drysdale, and John Worthington as joint Health Officers of the Town and Port of Baltimore (see record of Commissions &c)

Ordered That the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Benjamin Mackall Esquire One hundred pounds for six months salary as a Judge of the Court of Appeals; due the first day of May last.
