By the Petition of Margaret and Abraham Adams of Frederick
County it is set forth that in the year 1792 they entered into recognizance for
the appearance of a certain George Adams, to answer for a supposed assault
on William Donovan, in the sum of ten pounds current money each, which by the
said George Adams's leaving the state has become forfeited. They alledge that the
said prosecution was a groundless one, as may be inferred from the said Donovan's
having dismissed a Civil suit which he had commenced for the same supposed
injury. They therefore pray a remission of the forfeiture; and their case being
recommended to the consideration of the Board by the Court of the said County
It is Ordered that the forfeitures aforesaid be, and they are (on payment
of Costs) hereby remitted. Signed
