

Ordered That the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Edward Roberts, eight pounds and one penny for riding expers with Gen Orders to Militia Officers, as per account passed by the Auditor;

Ordered That the said Treasurer pay to Jobb Fowler sixteen pounds one shilling and four pence, for Board &c found Thomas Whalley, as per account passed by the Auditor.

Ordered That the said Treasurer pay to Joseph Burneston Twenty two pounds ten shillings for riding expers with general orders to Militia Officers (account passed as aforesaid.)

Ordered That the said Treasurer pay to John Gray the sum of nine pounds sixteen shillings and two pence for riding expers with General Orders to Militia Officers, (account passed as above)

Ordered That the said Treasurer pay to Richard Flemming six pounds eighteen shillings and eleven pence for riding expers with dispatches to Field Officers of Kent and Queen Anne's Counties.

By a representation from the Chief Justice and Associates of the Court of Charles County, accompanied by an official Transcript it appears that Thomas Phenix has been fined on two several Presentments the sum of six each for retailing liquors without License. The said Justices set forth that Phenix had bought the stock in trade of Mess^{rs} Logan and W^o Elderry and that He prosecuted mercantile business in the same ^{town} and thought himself authorized to sell liquor under the License granted to those persons: They therefore recommend the remission of the said fines, so incurred through misapprehension of the Law. The Board accordingly direct that the said fines (excepting the sum of fifteen shillings be remitted.
