

Monday, September the 15th 1794.
The Council met. Present The Hon^{ble} William Pinkney
John Davidson and James Brice and
Henry Ridgely Esquires.

The Board being of opinion that the spirit of opposition
to Government and it's Laws now existing in the Counties of Washington
and Allegany in this State, and the actual disorders and violence, that
have taken place in consequence thereof require that His Excellency The
Governor should command in person the Detachment ordered to march
to Frederick Town for the purpose of counteracting the effects of the said
spirit and disorders, and of restoring tranquility and obedience,

It is therefore Ordered: That His Excellency the Governor
be and He is hereby advised by this Board to proceed to Frederick
Town, and there to take the Command of the aforesaid Detachment, and
in person to direct and conduct it's operations; and that this Board
do approve of the Governor's continuing so to command the said Detachment
until He shall be of opinion that the same is no longer necessary,
or until the Board shall otherwise Order.

Wednesday, September the 17th 1794.
The Council met. Present as on the 15th

Ordered: That the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to
Edward Roberts, four pounds twelve shillings and six pence
for riding express with dispatches to the General Officers of Militia.

Friday September the 19th 1794.
The Council met. Present as before.

Ordered That the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to
John Helmott, seven pounds eleven shillings and ten pence for riding
express with General Orders to Militia Officers, as per account paper
by the Auditor
