

Whereas by the Petition of James Fisher of Dorchester County,
accompanied by a Transcript from the proceedings of the Court of the said County,
it appears that the said James Fisher was at the last October Term, fined
on two several presentments, in the sum of six pounds each for selling spirituous
liquors and stuffing the same to be drank in his House without Licence;
and Whereas the Petitioner sets forth that He was led into a belief that the
permission of two Magistrates was sufficient to authorize him to retail liquor;
and that by their permission and advice He thus ignorantly offended against
the Law; and the Justices of the Court of the said County having certified
their belief that the facts set forth are true, and having recommended that
the Petitioner should be relieved, It is ordered that the aforesaid fines be
and (on payment of all costs) they are hereby remitted.
