Tuesday, October the 21st 1794.

The Council met. Present His Excellency the Governor, and
all the members.

By the Petition of Jane Monk accompanied by an official
Transcript from the Court of Charles County, it appears that the Petitioner
was at the last March Term fined on two several Presentments in the
sum of six pounds each for retailing liquor without licence. And it
being represented that she is extremely poor, with six small children
to support, and the said facts being attested by two Justices of the
peace for the said County, It is Ordered That upon payment of
Costs, the said fines be and they are hereby remitted.
