

Thursday, November the 20th 1794.

John Davidson, James Brice, Henry Ridgely, and William Kelly Esquires, Counsellors Elect, appeared in the Council room, and were qualified as such agreeably to the Constitution and Laws of this State, before Allen Duvyn Esquire one of the Justices of the Peace for Anne Arundel County, by taking, repeating, and subscribing the several oaths and the declaration prescribed for that purpose, as also by taking the oath of support to the Government of the United States.

The Council being assembled, present
His Excellency John Hoshens Stone, Governor, and
all the qualified Members;

John Kelly was re-appointed Clerk of the Council, and immediately qualified as such before Henry Ridgely Esquire one of the Aldermen of the City of Annapolis, by taking and subscribing the several Oaths and the declaration prescribed for that purpose by the Constitution and by the Laws of this State and of the United States.

Jubb Fowler was re-appointed Messenger to the Council.

The Board received the Return of the Election of Sheriffs for Talbot County, declaring Daniel Powell Cox and Edward Roberts duly elected, whereupon Commission was issued to Daniel Powell Cox Esquire as Sheriff of Talbot County.

The Board received also the Return of the Sheriffs Election for Cecil County, declaring Peregrine Briscoe and Samuel Maffitt duly elected, whereupon Commission was issued to Peregrine Briscoe Esquire as Sheriff of Cecil County.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Benjamin Rumsey Esquire, fifty pounds for one quarter's salary, and to Benjamin Mackall and Thomas Jones One hundred pounds each, for six months salary, due them respectively on the first instant, as Judges of the Court of Appeals.

Ordered That the said Treasurer pay to Frederick Green, printer to this State, four hundred and sixty eight pence fifteen shillings, current money, being a balance of salary due first instant, as per account passed by the Auditor.
