

A Letter dated the 8th of November 1794 was received from Uriah Forrest Esquire, notifying the resignation of his Seat as a Representative in Congress for the third District of this State; Whereupon it was Ordered that Writs of Election issue to the Sheriffs of Montgomery and Frederick Counties in the usual form, for supplying the vacancy thus occasioned; The said Election, to be held on the Eighth day of December next, and continued agreeably to Law: Writs of Election were issued accordingly.

By a Representation made by the Chief and Associate Justices of Dorchester County Court, it appears that a certain Catharine Ingles was at the last October Term of the said Court convicted on two Indictments for selling Cyder (without licence), and the Justices aforesaid having declared their belief that the said Catharine Ingles is very poor, and unable to pay the fines incurred in consequence of the said conviction, it is Ordered that upon payment of costs, the said fines, amounting to seven pounds ten shillings be, and they are hereby repealed.
