Monday December 8. 1794.

The Council met. Present His Excellency the Governor and the Honble William Pinkney, John Davidson, James Bruce and Henry Bridgely, Esquires.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Mr Prichard Owen Twenty shillings due him per account allowed by the Governor for a Boyer's French Dictionary furnished Miss Grayson.

Ordered, That the said Treasurer pay to Mr. William Wilkins one pound ten shillings for paper furnished for the use of the Council.

On receipt of a letter from Joshua Clayton, Esquire, Governor of the Delaware State enclosing copies of Indictments found in the Courts of that State against William Andrew, Thomas Smith, Solomon Mitchell, William Whitely, Zachariah Carey and James Hall for offences with which they severally stand charged. Stating that they have fled to this State from Justice and are now supposed to be in Caroline Dorchester or Somerset County in this State and requiring that agreeably to the Constitution of the United States that measures may be taken for the arresting the said William Andrew, Thomas Smith, Solomon Mitchell, William Whitely, Zachariah Carey and James Hall in order that they may be delivered to the persons to be appointed for that purpose on the part of the said State having jurisdiction of the Crimes wherewith they are charged - Warrants were issued to the Sheriffs of Caroline Dorchester and Somerset Counties accordingly.
